Muddy Shores 16th May

10-3pm, meet at Knott End Car Park Identifying and classifying species on the shore with a look at littoral zonation and strand lines.

Saltmarsh 6th June

10am-3pm, meet at Riverside Room, Wyre Estuary Country Park Identifying salt marsh species, formation of salt marshes and how to survey.

Freshwater Ecology 4th July

10am-3pm, meet at
Springfield House, Scorton
Learn to identify common
species found in freshwater
habitats and how to measure
the health of a river with both
biotic and abiotic factors.

Morecambe Bay Food Web 11th July

11am-4pm, meet at RLNI Centre, Fleetwood Familiarisation with species and food chains in the bay, including a bird survey.

Small mammals, birds and wildlife photography 16th July

10am-3pm, meet at Riverside Room, Wyre Estuary Country Park Conduct a mammal population survey, a bird survey of the salt marsh and surrounding area and get some top tips on wildlife photography!

Sand Dunes 18th July

10am-3pm, meet at Rossall Point, Fleetwood Familiarisation with sand dune species and their adaptations. Surveying and discussion of zonation and succession.

Please bring food and drinks for the day. You need suitable clothing and footwear (wet weather gear, wellies, boots). There is no charge for these courses and you may select which days you wish to attend, however booking is essential.
