

- Convening bioscientists to discuss current issues and evidence with one another, and with policy makers: over 60 online events and meetings.
- Bringing the expertise of our professional membership direct to policy makers in Government, Parliament and beyond: 17 letters, statements, reports and responses, also searchable in our online RSB & MO Policy Resource Library.





Supporting the next generation of bioscientists to gain policy experience and connections:
 2 UKRI policy interns joined our staff team, 150 early career professionals formed a new plant health network, 10 students carried out summer projects meeting Defra science priorities through our Plant Health Undergraduate Studentships (PHUGS).

Science Policy: ongoing



- Supporting UKBSC to engage with Home Office: animal research policy and regulations.
- Engaging with UKCORI, UKRI and UKRN: research integrity.
- Engaging with Defra and Cabinet Office: biological security, including our response submitted to the call for evidence on the UK's Biological Security Strategy.
- Working with IOP and RSC gathering evidence and engaging policymakers: delays in Horizon Europe association; signatory to the 'Stick to Science' campaign.
- PHUGS programme continues: further funding means projects increased to 13.
- 2 new UKRI policy internships.
- Thank you to all our members, funders, supporters and collaborators across groups, initiatives, projects and programmes.

Education Policy



- Working with other societies, we called for an uplift in funding for science CPD for teachers, provide evidence for the review of 2020 qualifications in Scotland and the Curriculum for Excellence.
- Produced briefings on STEM education for MSP candidates in May and on **Level 3 Qualifications** in applied sciences for the Department for Education.



Education Policy



- Kept watching brief on exam disruptions and engaged directly with DfE on proposals to reform Initial Teacher Training in England and Qualifications Wales regarding their new qualifications for Wales.
- As host organisation for collaborative education policy work of ASE, IOP, RS, RSB and RSC we commissioned research into entry requirements for post-16 qualifications across all four UK nations.


Overview



- Financial year 1 October
 2020 31 September 2021
- Better than budgeted year with small operational cash surplus of £82k
- Modest growth in income compared to previous year
- Significant reduction in expenditure
