RSB Launches New Online Training Course on Project Management

The Royal Society of Biology's online training platform [myLearning](#) is continuing to grow.

The Society has recently launched a new online course: An Introduction to Project Management. This is adapted from the Society's popular face-to-face project management course, which we have been providing since 2013.

This online course is highly interactive, containing exercises, videos and an area for taking notes. The course will provide a flexible option for those who may be unable to attend our face-to-face course.

Course participants will gain a broad overview of project management and will receive a certificate and CPD points on completion of the course.

Project Management is a highly transferable skill and this course will be useful to those new to project management or those who have become involved in project management with no formal training in this area.

He is co-presenter/ producer of the award-winning Space Boffins Podcast and acclaimed Planet Earth Podcast for the Natural Environment Research Council.


