

I will be graduating in July with a degree in sociology and would consider this to be a great opportunity to build on the skills and experience that I have already acquired in this area.

I hope you can appreciate the relevance of my experience and the personal strengths I have developed, which would be of immense benefit to the role. Cover letter

- Keep it brief – probably one side
- Write as regular prose
- Complement the CV by going into greater depth on key skills

Application forms

Online portal/electronic forms

- Personal details etc
- Some detail about education/experience
- Written in regular prose
- More detail than a CV
- Refer to the job description/person specification



Your application should tell the recruiter

- Who you are
- Why you want this role (at this organisation)
- Why you are suitable to for the role
(skills/competencies/qualities)

Making your applications sing



Sounds obvious, but...

- Make it easy to read (short, clear sentences and paragraphs)
- Check and double check spelling and grammar!
- Tailor your application to the role and company

Answering questions

- Get specific – use detailed examples to show your skills/qualities
- Keep it relevant: always refer to the job description
- Use STAR/CAR to structure your answers



Application Tips

- Submit your application as early as possible and no later than 23:59pm on the closing date quoted in the advert.
- Be sure to include a cover letter if one is requested.
- Tailor your application to meet the needs of the person specification. Take note of the essential criteria. We will use your CV (and cover letter if applicable) to review your suitability to move to the next stage of the process.
- Provide a full and continuous history of your education/training and unemployment/work experience.
- Check all spelling and grammar. Do not rely solely on computer spellcheckers.
- Carefully consider any documentation that you choose to attach. All attachments should be relevant and add value to your application.
