

RSB Training Programme: Patently Valuable

A workshop about the issues surrounding translating biological innovation into commercially valuable intellectual property

Who is the course aimed at?

This half day course is aimed at innovators (PhD students, Postdocs and academics) and public relations workers.

What does the course cover?

The first part of the course will consider the key technical and practical requirements for obtaining patent protection for biological innovation.

The second part of the course will then look at the ethical challenges particular to biological innovation, in particular the issues raised by medical technologies such as stem cell treatments, and how these are dealt with by patent offices.
