- If I think hard enough I'll know what I want to do








In reality




Life science career pathways - examples

Making the most of the societies here today

- Chat with them (that's why they have come!)

- Will you be a *passive* member (i.e. receive updates, use published information, put membership on your CV)?
- Will you be an *active* member (i.e. all of the above, plus get actively involved, enter competitions, go to events, join groups...)?







The societies here today: 8 ways they can help your career

- Connect you to the scientific community know what's going on in a wider context, including at a policy level
- 2. Meet people and connect at meetings and events
- 3. Take part in competitions, potential to win awards (e.g. Physiological Society has an award for UG research)

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The societies here today: 8 ways they can help your career

- 5. Receive mentoring
- 6. Apply for 'studentships' (NB sometimes you need to have been a member for 12 months plus to do this) and gain other benefits e.g. Physiological Society has 50 undergraduate vacation studentships per year
- 7. Apply for internships and/or summer schools
- 8. Use careers info and ideas on their websites and

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




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
