The 20th Annual Teachers' meeting was held at Surgeons' Hall in Edinburgh. The Annual Teachers' Meeting organised by the Scotland Branch of the Society of Biology aims to inspire, challenge and motivate Biology teachers from across Scotland.

June

For the second year, Council organised the Top Biology Student in Scotland Award for

the best Biology undergraduate – on the basis of academic performance and outreach work. The Top students were awarded with their certificates at the Science and the Parliament event in November 2015.

October

During the third Biology Week coordinated by the Royal Society of Biology, Jane Magill, Janice Barr and Kevin O'Dell took part is a series of events representing the Society.

November

Science and the Parliament event. This event is aimed at promoting engagement between members of the scientific community, MSPs and other policy makers in the Scottish Parliament and Government. The 2015 event focussed on the Scottish General Election. In addition to Society of Biology representation at the event, we presented the Society of Biology awards for the 2015 top performing students in Higher Biology, Higher Human Biology, Higher Biotechnology and Advanced Higher Biology.

Looking ahead to the start of 2016, there are significant changes afoot in the way the Branch operates mainly as a consequence of a reduced budget. Several of the main stay events/activities will either be out sourced or will not take place in the same way for example the Peter Wilson lecture, although still taking place, the RSB will no longer contribute. The annual Teachers' meeting will still take place and is scheduled for May 2016. Synapse/ Talk Biology and the Network Co-ordinators are in play and although the management team is comprises Branch members, the initiative functions out with the Branch. A proposal regarding the formation of a Scotland-based Special Interest Group of the RSB will be presented to Council in December enabling the Society to be fully represented and active in Scotland in terms of Policy, consultation and outreach.

Our busy programme would not of course be possible without our willing volunteer Branch Council members.

I would like to thank them all for their time and enthusiasm over the year (and 2012/13). They have been a dependable source of support and I looking forward to working with them all in this my second year as Chair.
